Hold on to your hats for the second half of the season! It will be a busy one to kick off our 150th celebration. We start the new year off with a bang with the Calder-Conley-Hurd mixed bonspiel starting Thursday, Janu-

ary 4. This is always a fun event, so get your team in now or sign up as a single to get assigned to a team. We wish January with the Mitchell Invitational Bonspiel (men, January 11-14), the Empire State Bonspiel (women, January 11-14) and the Club Mixed Championship (January 25, 27-28). All club members are encouraged to put in a team for the year. Five top finishing teams automatically qualify for the Cobb Mixed in February, and one lucky participant will be drawn from the hat to enter the Cobb as well.

In February, we host the Kayser mixed bonspiel (February 1-4) for curlers with 5 years or less experience. This is a great way for newer curlers to play together. If you are an eligible curler, don't miss this opportunity to meet and play against others of similar skills and experience. You will make lifelong curling friends during this event. (The Kayser was my first out-of-town bonspiel many years ago.) The Uca Curling Club College Bonspiel comes to town February 9-11, featuring college teams from around the region. And the Cobb Mixed is our marquee international mixed event, February 15-18. There will of course be curling in the Olympics this February 8-25, including the first-ever Mixed Doubles competition. On Saturday, February 24, we will open our doors to the public to try the roaring game. Please volunteer to help make this a memorable day for our visitors and potential new members in 2018.

In our last month of curling this season, the women hold their championship (Glengarry Challenge, March 1, 3-4), and the Gordon International Bonspiel, featuring 20 men's teams each from Canada and the USA, visit to compete in their annual friendly medal competition dating to 1884. We will also cram in a 3-week Olympic Curling School on Sundays, March 4-18 to get folks in the mood to curl with us next year. Finally, we close our season with the members-only Rose Bonspiel, March 22-24. New curlers, make yourself available and get on a Rose team! This is a fun way to end the curling season, and a new curler was on the winning team last year. This year it could be you!

Attorney Joseph H. Hobika, Sr. 1933 - 2017
UTICA, NY - Joseph H. Hobika, Sr., 84, a gifted lawyer, a patient mentor and a loving father, passed away on Wednesday, December 6, 2017, in the comfort of his home surrounded by his family's love.

Joe was born in Uca, NY on February 15, 1933, the youngest son of the late Habib and Lucia (Nassar) Hobika. He attended local schools and was the 1950 Salutatorian of T.R. Proctor High School. He received a Bachelor of Arts Degree, graduating Cum Laude, from Uca College of Syracuse University in 1953. In 1956, he received his Juris Doctorate Degree from Syracuse University College of Law, graduating Magna Cum Laude and was awarded the distinguished Order of the Coif honor. He was admitted to the bar that same year and began to practice law.

Joe joined the U.S. [Army](#) and served as a Captain in the Judge Advocate General's Corp. He also served as a legal officer for the 414th Civil Affairs Co. until 1968. Following his military service, he became a partner in the established firm of Callanen, Foley and Hobika. Joe was general counsel to the Uca Urban Renewal Agency since its inception in 1964. He also served as an attorney for every city administration and all nine mayors since 1962. Joe also served as the Chairman of the Uca Industrial Development Agency since 1992. He was legal counsel for the ARC of Oneida and Lewis Counties for over forty years.

Joe was elected to the Uca School Board and served for 25 years and served as its President for several years. Joe took personal pride in being instrumental in the desegregation of the Uca City Schools. Joe served as a Trustee Emeritus of the Community Foundation of Herkimer and Oneida Counties. Joe spent the last years of his career, practicing law on a daily basis with his family providing them wisdom, guidance, mentoring and perspective, which will always be treasured.

By all accounts, Joe was a man who was revered as a good listener and sounding board. He always made himself available to his family, his friends, his colleagues and his clients to discuss any problems, concerns or issues in a non-judgmental manner and would provide clear analysis, perspective and wisdom created to his audience. His humble manner always allowed the recipient of his counsel to make a decision tailored

to their own standpoint or interest.

Aside from his family and friends, Joe's greatest joy was practicing law. Joe was considered by his colleagues to be a lawyer's lawyer and he practiced law the way it was supposed to be done.

On April 4, 1959, Joe was joined in marriage to the former Madeline Zogby. Joe and Madeline shared over 54 loving years, living and raising their seven children in Uca. His beloved Madeline passed away on May 12, 2013.

Joe was a member of the New York State and Oneida County Bar Association. He also enjoyed memberships at the Fort Schuyler Club, Skenandoa Golf Club, The Yahundasis Golf Club and the Sugar Mill Country Club of New Smyrna Beach, FL.

Scoring three

Good things come in threes, not the least of which is a score of three in curling. The trouble is, your opponents are likely to vigorously object to your trying to do so. When you are down 2 or 3 in the last end, scoring three is highly desirable or perhaps imperative. So how do you set up a score of three?

First of all, you will realistically need to have last rock advantage to have a reasonable chance of scoring three. This is what we will focus on in this article. Second, you will need a little, but not much, help from your opponents in the way of misses or half-shots to generate your three. Finally, you have to make all your shots. This is a tall order, for sure, but quite possible. The following discussion assumes the 4-rock free guard zone rule. Beginning October 2018, the 5-rock free guard zone will go in effect, and setting up your three with last rock will become significantly easier.

Basic strategy

You will need two corner guards to set up a possible three-spot. If your opponent is up 3 without hammer in the last end, they are probably throwing through. The strategy doesn't change much if your opponents play in the rings, except you will have the additional opportunity to play a so weight hit and roll behind one or the other corner instead of drawing around them. If your opponents try to draw around your corner guards, you can draw in front of them (if they are behind tee line), tap them back (if above tee-line), draw behind them (if they

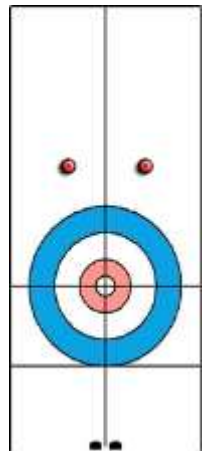
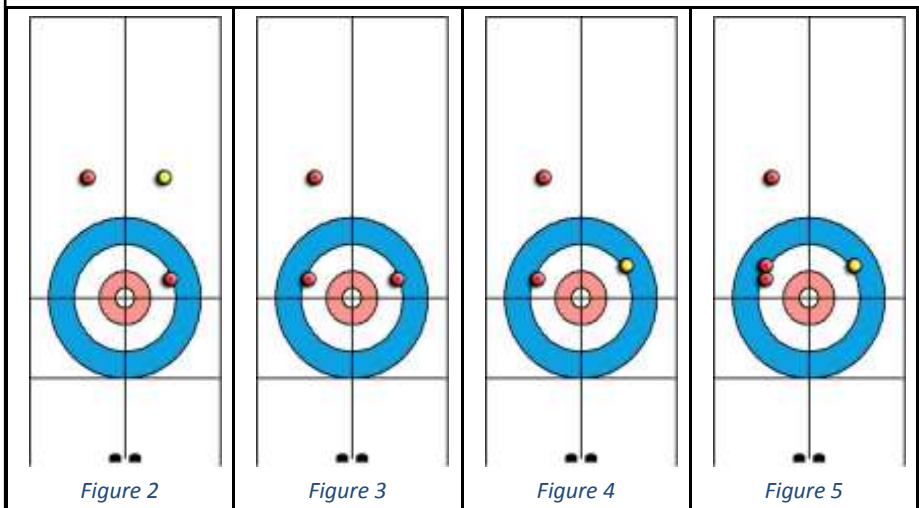

are very high in the rings), or run in your corner guard. Usually, having opponents stones in the house will make your job easier by providing catchers, backers, or things to hit and roll from.

The basic starting position is Figure 1, after your opponents have thrown through twice and you have set up your two corner guards. (You are red.) Your opponents should begin peeling your corner guards when seconds come up. (If not, then you can proceed to come around your corners right away to set up a multiple score without interference.) When your opponents peel one of your corner guards you will replace it. Be patient! When your opponents miss your corner guard, or nose hit it, this is the miss or half-shot you need to set up a potential score of three. The most common miss is a nose hit on your corner guard. In any case, as soon as you get the necessary miss or half-shot, you will come around one of the corner guards (Figure 2). Your opponents should peel the guard over shot rock (best), when you will then go around the other corner (Figure 3). At this point, your opponents should hit your open stone (best, Figure 4). If instead your opponents peel your corner guard, you will replace it and remain lying two until skip rocks. (You have last stone, so this defensive strategy will leave you drawing for three with your last rock. If the opponents continue to peel your corner guard until your first skip stone, then you will draw into the house and sit three spread with your first skip rock, forcing a three unless your oppo-



nents can throw a double or make an absolutely perfect nose freeze.) Once you reach the position of Figure 4 you will now draw around your corner guard again to lie two potential counters (Figure 5). Once you reach this position, you should have a good chance to score three. If the opponents peel your corner guard, you will replace it. If they draw in another rock you will remove it or look for a double. Even if your opponents make all their shots after you reach the position of Figure 5, with your last shot, you should have a draw, open hit and sack, or a double for three. If your opponents miss (draw not for shot or miss a hit) or throw a half-shot (e.g. hit and roll out) at any time, you will have a simple draw or hit-and-sack for three with your last shot.
